INTRODUCTION

This report covers activities that took place in the District from 1st January to 25th March 2026, representing the first quarter of the year 2026.

UPDATE ON MEMBERSHIP STATISTICS

The total membership for the period under review increased from 5,143 as of 31st December 2025 to 5,211 March 2026 representing 1.32% within the District.

FINANCIAL REPORT

- i. The District has been able to forward all weekly remittances within the period to the various higher courts.
- ii. Two out of the three Almanac Weeks celebrated within the reporting period have been duly remitted to the Presbytery. These include Bible Week and Children’s Week, while Youth Week is yet to be remitted.

NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS & EVENTS

1. “Love Connects” Program

On 14th February 2026, the District organized a program dubbed “Love Connects” for both married couples and singles. The program was organized in collaboration with the Police Church at Odorkor.

The facilitator for the program was Cat. Micheal Asare-Ansah from PCG Calvary Congregation, Ofankor. The session focused on strengthening relationships, promoting healthy Christian values in marriages, and guiding singles on godly relationships.

The program was well attended, with over 150 participants drawn from within the District. Participants actively engaged in the discussions and expressed appreciation for the practical insights shared during the session.

2. Training on Data Management and Report Writing

The District, in collaboration with the District Committee on Administration, Human Resource and Management (AHRM), organized a training workshop on data management and report writing.

The training was designed for Session Clerks, Administrators, and executives of the various groups within the District to strengthen their capacity in data handling and reporting. The objective was to improve the quality, accuracy, and timeliness of reports submitted at the District level.

The workshop recorded 32 participants, and the training provided participants with practical guidance on proper documentation, data management, and effective report preparation.

3. Induction of District Committee Chairpersons and YAY Executives

The District Session Council Standing Committee, in collaboration with the District Committee on Church Life and Nurture, organized an induction service for newly elected YAY executives and District Committee Chairpersons.

During the ceremony, the newly elected leaders were officially inducted into office and given their charge of responsibility. They were encouraged to lead diligently and ensure that their respective committees and groups function effectively in fulfilling the mission and vision of the Church within the District.

4. Ga West Presbytery School of Ministry Graduation

The maiden graduation ceremony of the Ga West Presbytery School of Ministry, held on Friday, 20th March 2026 at 9:00 a.m., was hosted by the Mamprobi District at the PCG Ebenezer Congregation, Mamprobi.

The event was attended by the Presbytery Chairman, the Presbytery Session Clerk, members of the School's Board, as well as other District Ministers and Ministers within the Presbytery.

Conclusion

The activities organized within the period under review contributed significantly to spiritual growth, leadership development, and administrative efficiency within the District. The District remains committed to organizing impactful programs and strengthening the operational capacity of its leadership and groups.


