2.0 OPENING DEVOTION

7.1 **Church Planting**

The meeting was informed that twenty-three (23) out of the forty (40) bicentennial churches have been planted, with sixteen (16) more to go. Districts which were yet to plant any, were requested to do so as soon as possible.

7.2 **New Year Forum / Bicentennial Lecture**

The above programmes came off as scheduled, and participation was encouraging.

7.3 **Emergency Presbytery Session**

The Emergency Presbytery Session came off as scheduled, and the 2026 proposed budget was approved.

9.0 **DAY'S BUSINESS**

9.1 **2026 (10th) Presbytery Session**

The Chairperson informed the meeting that due to a scheduled travel with the Moderator of the General Assembly, the Presbytery Session Council Standing Committee decided that the 2026 (10th) Presbytery Session should be held from Thursday 23rd to Sunday 26th April, 2026 instead of the earlier date decided by the Council, that is Wednesday 8th to Sunday 12th April, 2026. A virtual constitution of the Session will be held on Tuesday 2nd April, 2026 to enable the Workshop Groups begin their meetings.

9.2 **10th Anniversary Celebrations**

Two (2) activities were observed during the period. The Festival of Nine Lessons and Carol and Youth Games. Both activities were massively attended. The Awoshie District emerged as winners of the football match.

9.3 50/50 Contribution Audit

The Clerk read out the arrears as identified by the audits carried out by the Head Office and Presbytery Audit Teams. The districts in arrears were encouraged to pay up as soon as possible.

In the ensuing discussion, it was decided that each District/Sub-District/Mission Field will contribute at least one thousand Ghana cedis (GH¢1,000.00) to see the Moderator off. It was also decided that each zone will host the Moderator for lunch. All Districts/Sub-Districts/Mission Field were encouraged to ensure that they were duly represented during the Moderator's visit.

9.5 Bicentennial and Related Issues

The Chairperson requested all Districts/Sub-Districts to encourage their members to contribute towards the Kutunse project for the year 2026. He also announced that the attire for the 2026 Easter Sunday was the bicentennial cloth, so those who don't have should get theirs at the Presbytery Office.

9.6 Credit Union Issues

The Chairperson reminded the Council of the existence of Credit Unions within the Presbytery, which were established to help needy individuals, congregations and district. He noted however, that some districts and congregations do not patronize these credit unions, however when they are cash strapped, they expect someone to bail them out. He encouraged all districts and congregations who have not yet joined any credit union, especially the Presbytery Credit Union to do, so that they can assist them when the need arises. He also pleaded with those who have secured loans from the credit unions to pay up as scheduled.

10.0 VISITORS TO SESSION

10.1 Presbyterian Press

A delegation from the Presbyterian Press were at the Council meeting to introduce their products to the Council. The Chairperson encouraged all districts and congregations to patronize the press.

10.2 GAP Microfinance

They were at the Council to market the Ga Presbytery Microfinance. They highlighted their products and invited the Council members to come and save with them, and also to secure loans for their projects and emergency issues.

11.0 FINANCIAL ISSUES

The Director of Finance, Mr. Emmanuel Osei Ofosu, took members through a number of schedules which has been given out. He then presented the Presbytery's Income and Expenditure for January and February 2026. He noted that remittance from the districts delay, and so requested that the districts should ensure they operate according the dates set for remitting the higher courts. He informed the meeting that the Awoshie District has started paying the 50/50, but the Manhean District has not. He also requested all districts/sub-districts/mission field to ensure that they follow the directives on the payment of the Agents Retirement Support Fund, to ensure smooth administration of the fund.

In the ensuing discussion, the Manhean District was advised to start remitting the 50/50 as soon as possible, to avoid future complications.

12.0 OFFICE COMPLEX FUNDRAISING

The Chairperson expressed his appreciation to all the districts/sub-districts for their support in raising funds towards the construction of the office complex especially the one on 28th December, 2025 during the Christmas season.

13.0 ANY OTHER BUSINESS

13.1 10th Anniversary Souvenirs

A member suggested that the souvenirs should be produced on demand because those assigned to the districts/sub-districts are not being patronised by the congregants, meanwhile it is expected that districts/sub-districts who have been given should make payment for them.

13.2 Prayer Centre

A member opined that there is the need to consciously fund the Presbytery's Prayer Centre to ensure its growth and effectiveness. The member also pointed out that he has seen a structure on the premises of the centre which does not belong to the Church.

In response, the Chairperson said that the Presbytery has been consciously supporting the centre financially, but it is not so significant of late due to the construction of the office complex. He then appealed to all districts to extend a supporting hand to the centre. Regarding the structure on the premises, the Chairperson said that the structure is an encroachment, and that the necessary action is being taken.

14.0 ANNOUNCEMENT

The Clerk of Presbytery made the following announcements:

14.1 10th (2026) Presbytery Session Fees

The fees have been communicated in writing, and so all must endeavour to pay as soon as possible.

14.2 Presentation of Situational Reports

All to note that every district/sub-district/mission field/department is expected to submit situational reports to Council meetings.

14.3 Holy Saturday Convention

Scheduled for 4th April, 2026 at the Prayer Centre, Kokrobite. All were encouraged to attend.

14.4 2026 Catechists Consecration

Scheduled for Friday 27th March, 2026 at the AOT Congregation at 9:00am.

14.5 Children Service Conference

Scheduled for Saturday 28th and Sunday 29th April, 2026 hosted by the Dansoman District. Districts/Sub-Districts/Mission Field were encouraged to sponsor the participation of their Children Service Teachers.

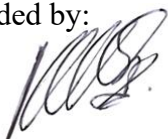
14.6 Signing of 2026 Performance Target Agreements

12.0 CLOSING

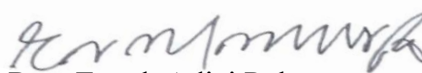

2026 FIRST QUARTER PSC MEETING (26TH MARCH, 2026) EXHORTATION

Theme: The Foundation of Faithful Leadership

Text: Matthew 16:13-17

Introduction

I wish to seize this opportunity to express my sincere appreciation to Papa Chairperson and Papa Clerk for granting me the privilege to share a word with this august gathering. I do not take this honour for granted.

Papa Chair, senior colleagues in ministry, honourable lay reps from our districts, our hardworking directors – fellow labourers in the vineyard of our Lord,

Our church this year has been reflecting on a beautiful theme: *"Celebrating Our Heritage: Building on the Foundation Already Laid."* And we have been reminded from 1 Corinthians 3:11 that *"no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ."* I speak to you on the theme: **"The Foundation of Faithful Leadership."**

We gather today as leaders of our Presbytery – those entrusted with oversight, with teaching, with guiding the affairs of the church here at Ga West. We sit on this council, we make decisions, we shape the direction of our congregations and institutions within our Presbytery. But before we do any of that, we must pause and ask ourselves a foundational question. It is the same question Jesus asked His disciples in the region of Caesarea Philippi. It is the question that determines everything else about our leadership.

The Question That Defines Us

Jesus was in a region filled with competing voices. Caesarea Philippi was a place where people worshipped the Greek god Pan, where they honoured Caesar as lord, where the air was thick with pagan temples and political propaganda. In the midst of all that noise, Jesus turned to His disciples and asked: *"Who do people say the Son of Man is?"*

They gave Him the opinions of the day: *"Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets."* All respectable answers. All associating Jesus with great men of God. But all of them – wrong. Because Jesus is more than a prophet with world renown; Jesus is more than a teacher of repentance; Jesus is more than a miracle worker. Jesus, is more than all these!

Then Jesus made it personal. He looked at these men who had walked with Him, who had witnessed His miracles, who had heard His teaching – and He asked: *"But what about you? Who do you say I am?" (v.15)* Beloved in the Lord, this question is not merely a moment from the Gospels. It is the perennial question that stands before every generation of church leaders. In our Presbytery council, in our sessions, in our congregations, we will face many pressing issues: budgets, property, personnel, programs, policies. But the most urgent question is not *what* we are doing, it is *who* we say Jesus is.

The Confession That Anchors Us

Simon Peter answered: *"You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." (v.16)*

Notice what Peter did not say. He did not say, "You are a great teacher." He did not say, "You are a prophet like Jeremiah." He did not say, "You are a moral example." He declared Jesus to be the Christ, the anointed One, the fulfilment of all God's promises to Israel. And he declared Jesus to be the Son of the living God, not merely a human leader, but divine.

That confession became the foundation of the church. Jesus said, *"On this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it."*

Now, my brothers and sisters, hear this carefully. The rock upon which Christ builds His church is not Peter himself, it is the confession Peter made. It is the truth that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the living God. That truth is the foundation. And that same truth must be the foundation of our leadership.

Our church theme reminds us that we are building on a foundation already laid. We are not called to invent a new foundation. We are not called to build on the shifting sands of public opinion, political convenience, or pragmatic strategy. We are called to build on Jesus Christ, and on the confession that He is Lord.

The Source That Sustains Us

Now, what is remarkable about this passage is what Jesus says next. After blessing Peter, He adds: *"For this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven."* (v.17)

Peter's confession did not come from his own intellect. It was not the result of his education or his reasoning. It was a gift of divine revelation.

This is a crucial word for us as leaders. We are ministers, catechists, presbyters, directors, men and women who have studied, who have trained, who have experience. But we must never trust in flesh and blood. We must never rely solely on our own wisdom, our own expertise, or our own strength. Faithful leadership flows from what the Father reveals, not from what flesh and blood achieves.

Every decision we make on this council, every sermon we preach in our pulpits, every catechism lesson we teach, every department we direct – if it is to bear lasting fruit, it must come from hearts that have received revelation from the Father. We must know Christ not merely by reputation, but by revelation.

Application: The Question Confronting Our Leadership Today

Now, beloved leaders, we cannot simply admire Peter's confession and return to business as usual. The same Jesus who asked the disciples in Caesarea Philippi is asking us – here and now – the same question. And He asks it in the face of challenges that confront our church in this generation.

First, we see that certain practices that resemble idolatry are steadily finding their way into many churches in Africa, and Ghana in particular. They are becoming popular. They are magnetic, drawing many unsuspecting people. And Jesus is asking us as leaders of the Church: *Who do you say that I am?* Will Jesus continue to occupy the centre of the practices of the congregations in our Presbytery? Or will we allow syncretism to erode our worship? The question demands an answer.

Second, we observe that emphasis in the church is increasingly placed on numerical growth, sometimes at the expense of spiritual growth. Many church leaders are using modern advertising strategies to create crowds more than they are labouring to create mature believers. Some seek the power of numbers to pursue political leverage, rather than preparing members to be more like Christ. In the midst of this, Jesus is asking: *Who do you say that I am?* Are we seeking to draw influence and power from our numbers, or from Christ, the Sovereign of the Church?

Third, we live in an era where celebrity church leaders draw attention to themselves, their brands, their platforms, their personalities, sometimes overshadowing Jesus, the Head of the Church. And Jesus asks us: *Who do you say that I am?* Is Jesus the ultimate goal of our ministry, or have fame and politics become the driving force? Let us search our hearts.

Fourth, we face a society that is becoming more and more secularized. God is being pushed to the fringes of life. And even in church leadership, there is a subtle reliance on the arm of flesh – on human strategy, political connections, financial muscle, rather than on Jesus, who is the Owner of the Church. In this era, Jesus asks: *Who do you say that I am?* Will we, as leaders of this Presbytery, ensure that we make Him the centre of our own lives and of the people we lead?

Conclusion: Building on the Foundation

Fellow leaders, these are not easy questions. But they are necessary questions. The foundation of faithful leadership is not our strategies, our numbers, our platforms, or our influence. It is Jesus Christ – and the confession that He is the Messiah, the Son of the living God.

As we celebrate our heritage this year, let us remember that those who came before us built upon this same foundation. Now it is our turn. The foundation remains. The rock is secure. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

May it be said of us, as it was of Peter, that our confession came not from flesh and blood, but from the Father in heaven. And may the church we serve be built firmly on the foundation that can never be moved.
