SITUATION REPORT TO THE GA WEST PRESBYTERY SESSION COUNCIL (March to May 2026)

1.0 PREAMBLE

"The Lord has done great things for us, and we are filled with joy." (Psalm 126:3)

Grace, mercy, and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be multiplied unto the Presbytery Session Council.

The New Gbawe District of the Presbyterian Church of Ghana presents this consolidated report covering activities from March to May 2026. This report captures the spiritual, administrative, evangelistic, and developmental life of the District in obedience to ecclesiastical accountability and in furtherance of the mission of the Church.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

This report provides a comprehensive overview of activities undertaken across all congregations and preaching points of the New Gbawe District during the period under review.

The District is composed of 7 congregations and 4 preaching points working under the leadership of Ministers, Catechists, Agents-in-Charge, Session members, and Presbyters. Together, they continue to implement the vision of the Presbyterian Church of Ghana through worship, evangelism, discipleship, and community engagement.

3.0 NOTABLE EVENTS

The period under review witnessed several significant spiritual, administrative, and developmental events across the District.

3.1 Spiritual and District-Wide Events

Intensive revival programmes, fasting, prayer sessions, midweek services, and crusades were held across congregations.

The Emmaus Day Celebration (6th April 2026) was successfully observed at the Apostle Safo School of Arts and Sciences.

Continuous participation in post-Lenten spiritual programmes, including daily prayers and revival meetings.



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3.2 Leadership and Fellowship Development

Successful hosting of the 5th Annual District Conferences for the Young Adults Fellowship (YAF), Men's Fellowship, and Young People's Guild (YPG).

Elections, orientation, and commissioning of Presbyters and church officers were conducted across congregations.

Ushers' and Presbyters' orientation programmes were held to strengthen leadership capacity.

3.3 Educational and Youth Development Activities

The District hosted the Ga West Presbytery YPG's Mpaebo Ksee 2026 Edition.

The District hosted the Presbytery Zonal Quiz Competition.

The District Children's Service Quiz Competition (30th May 2026) was held at Prince of Peace Congregation.

3.4 Presbytery and External Engagements

The District participated in the Ga West Presbytery Pulpit Exchange Programme (31st May 2026) in support of the Kuntunse Project fundraising initiative.

3.5 Committee Activities

The District AHRM Committee organised a number of training sessions, both online and in person, for Clerks across the District.

Progress has been made with land documentation for five (5) locals.

The District's digital footprint has been enhanced through regular updates to its social media platforms (Instagram and X), as well as the District's online photo album.

The District Education Committee supported two (2) BECE candidates with study materials. In addition, all locals supported their BECE candidates with writing materials and mathematical sets.

The Education Committee also contacted two (2) university students by phone, checked on their welfare, and prayed with them.

The District Education Committee awarded a scholarship to one (1) member at Adom Preaching Point.

The District ESR Committee held a meeting with Gbawe Methodist Church and the Anglican Church, Gbawe, to discuss the formation of a Local Council of Churches.

The ESR Committee, together with the Ministers' Representative, attended the final funeral rites of the late Nii Adama Kwartei Quartey, Dzaasetse of the Gbawe Palace, on behalf of the District. A donation of GH¢500.00 was made to the family.



4.0 IMPLEMENTATION OF DISTRICT SESSION DECISIONS

The following decisions were implemented or are ongoing across the District:

- 4.1 Alignment of congregational visions with District ministerial responsibilities – Ongoing.
- 4.2 National Evangelism Sunday (March 2026) – Successfully observed across all congregations.
- 4.3 District Bus Fundraising Initiative (5th Anniversary Project) – Ongoing contributions.
- 4.4 Lenten devotional and prayer programmes – Successfully implemented.
- 4.5 Digital evangelism and media expansion – Increasing adoption across congregations.
- 4.6 Leadership development (orientation, induction, and commissioning of officers) – Completed in multiple congregations.
- 4.7 Evangelism and outreach programmes (house-to-house evangelism, prison outreach, and crusades) – Ongoing and active.

5.0 EVANGELISTIC ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

Evangelism remained central to the District's activities during the period.

5.1 District-Wide Evangelism

House-to-house evangelism was conducted across congregations and preaching points during National Evangelism Week.

Street evangelism, visitation of dormant members, and community outreach programmes were widely implemented.

5.2 Special Outreach Programmes

Mega evangelism programmes were conducted in collaboration with the Singing Band Union and Youth Associations, including health screening initiatives at El-Shaddai Preaching Point.

Prison outreach was undertaken at the Nsawam Male Prison, reaching over 100 inmates, with participation from the entire District.

Community outreach through food evangelism and children's ministry engagement was undertaken at Lord's Preaching Point.

5.3 Outcomes

- 5.3.1 Several souls were won across congregations.
- 5.3.2 Inactive members were reintegrated through visitation and follow-up.
- 5.3.3 Increased youth participation in evangelistic programmes was recorded.



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- 5.3.4 Digital evangelism was strengthened through livestreams and social media platforms.

6.0 CHALLENGES

The District encountered several challenges during the period.

6.1 Financial Challenges

- 6.1.1 Inconsistent financial contributions from members affected project execution.
- 6.1.2 Limited funds for infrastructure development and evangelistic programmes.
- 6.1.3 Pressure on congregational welfare systems.

6.2 Administrative Challenges

- 6.2.1 Delays in the submission of reports in some congregations.
- 6.2.2 Irregular attendance by some Session members affected decision-making efficiency.

6.3 Logistical and Infrastructure Challenges

- 6.3.1 Inadequate worship facilities in some preaching points.
- 6.3.2 Insufficient sound systems and equipment in selected congregations.
- 6.3.3 Transportation difficulties affecting outreach activities and coordination.

6.4 Spiritual and Membership Challenges

- 6.4.1 Low attendance at midweek services and evangelistic programmes.
- 6.4.2 Weak member commitment and punctuality in some congregations.
- 6.4.3 The need for stronger discipleship and follow-up systems for new converts.

6.5 Climate Change Challenges

- 6.5.1 Low attendance to church services during rainy days.
- 6.5.2 Kokroko Congregation is gets flooded during heavy downpours of rain.

7.0 UPCOMING EVENTS

The District has planned the following programmes for the next phase:

7.1 Open-Air Crusades and Revival Programmes (June–August 2026)



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Objective: Evangelism and spiritual renewal.

7.2 Entrepreneurial Development Programme (June 2026)

Objective: Economic empowerment of members.

7.3 Inter-Church Games (July 2026)

Objective: Foster unity and fellowship.

7.4 District 5th Anniversary Continuation Activities (2026)

Objective: Strengthen District identity and support infrastructure development.

7.5 Youth Evangelism Expansion (Ongoing)

Objective: "1-for-1 Soul-Winning" Initiative.

8.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

The District respectfully submits the following recommendations:

- 8.1 Strengthen financial stewardship education across all congregations.
- 8.2 Intensify discipleship and member-retention programmes.
- 8.3 Provide support for infrastructure development in preaching points.
- 8.4 Enhance training for Session members, committees, and group leaders.
- 8.5 Support the expansion of digital evangelism and media infrastructure.
- 8.6 Sustain and deepen District transportation and logistics development initiatives.
