**SITUATIONAL REPORT PRESENTED TO THE
JUNE 2026 PRESBYTERY SESSION COUNCIL MEETING**

PREAMBLE

“And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others.” — 2 Timothy 2:2

INTRODUCTION

To the glory of God, the Sakaman District presents its Situational Report for the period March to May 2026. The period under review was characterised by vibrant spiritual activities, leadership development, evangelistic outreach, educational support programmes, infrastructural development, and strengthened fellowship among members. Through God’s grace, the District continued to advance its mission of making disciples and nurturing believers for effective service.

1.0 MEMBERSHIP

1.1 STATISTICS

Membership across the District remained stable and encouraging. As at 31st May 2026, the total membership stood at 3,509, reflecting the continued commitment to fellowship, worship, and outreach across all congregations and preaching points.

1.2 CONGREGATIONS AND PREACHING POINTS

The Sakaman District presently comprises six (6) Congregations and two (2) Preaching Points, namely:

- Ramseyer Congregation
- Calvary Congregation
- Trinity Congregation
- Bethel Congregation
- Blessed Congregation
- Grace Congregation
- Adaman Preaching Point
- Krokorrhwe Preaching Point

2.0 FINANCIAL REPORT

The financial health of the District remains stable. All congregations complied with their remittance obligations, ensuring timely transfers to the Presbytery and General Assembly Office. The District continues to promote accountability, transparency, and prudent stewardship of resources.

3.0 ACHIEVEMENTS AND EVENTS

3.1 CHURCH LIFE AND NURTURE

The District identified a shortage of trained organists and choirmasters across congregations and preaching points and consequently commenced a four-month training programme in March 2026. Congregations and preaching points nominated prospective trainees to strengthen music ministry and ensure continuity in worship leadership.

The Young Adults Fellowship and Young People's Guild held their annual conferences on 14th March 2026. The YAF Conference served as an electoral conference during which new executives were elected to serve a three-year term.

The Bible Study and Prayer Group held its annual conference on 28th March 2026 at Bethel Congregation.

The District Choir organised its Easter Concert dubbed "Hope from the Cross II" on 2nd April 2026 at Ramseyer Congregation. The programme attracted members from across the District and highlighted the significance of Christ's death and resurrection.

The Second Quarter District Prayer Gathering was held on 22nd May 2026, bringing together members from all congregations for worship and prayer.

The District hosted the Ga West Presbytery Men's Fellowship Conference on 16th and 17th May 2026 at Ramseyer Congregation. The thanksgiving service was graced by the Presbytery Chairperson, Rev. Enoch Pobee.

3.2 MISSION AND EVANGELISM

a. Prison Ministry

The Young Adults Fellowship, on behalf of the District, visited James Camp Prison on 28th March 2026. Members worshipped with inmates, donated essential items, and shared the Word of God, demonstrating the church's commitment to holistic ministry.

b. Emmaus Day Evangelism

As part of Emmaus Day activities, an evangelism procession was held from Sakaman Blue Lagoon to Chabaa, led by the Women's Fellowship. The procession engaged community members along the route with the message of the Gospel.

c. Evangelism Week

The District successfully observed Evangelism Week, climaxing with house-to-house witnessing and Operation Show Your Convert. Members actively participated in soul-winning activities across the District, reinforcing the church's evangelistic mandate.

3.3 ADMINISTRATION AND HUMAN RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

As part of succession planning and efforts to prepare for the replacement of retiring catechists, the District sponsored four members for catechist training at the Ramseyer Training Centre:

- Benjamin Odoi
- Afrifa Lopez
- Isaac Asuah
- Josephine Walker

The trainees comprise three males and one female. A fifth prospective candidate has expressed interest and is expected to begin training soon. This initiative reflects the District's commitment to long-term human resource development and the sustainability of ministry.

3.4 ECUMENICAL AND SOCIAL RELATIONS

The annual Emmaus Day Celebration was held successfully on 6th April 2026 at Radiantly School Park, Chabaa. Activities included a cooking competition, quiz competition, football, tug of peace, lime and spoon race, musical chairs, and children's recreational activities, fostering community spirit and inter-congregational fellowship.

The District paid a courtesy visit to the Sakaman Mosque and donated bags of rice, sugar, cooking oil, and sachets of Salem Water as a gesture of goodwill and peaceful coexistence, reflecting the church's dedication to harmonious interfaith relations.

The District also actively supported the Kutunse Project fundraising initiative through exchange of pulpits and coordinated fundraising efforts, demonstrating solidarity with the broader Presbytery.

3.5 DEVELOPMENT AND SOCIAL SERVICES

Following the acquisition of land for the Krokohwe Preaching Point, construction of a pavilion commenced during the period under review. By the end of May 2026, work had progressed to the lintel level. Efforts are ongoing to mobilise resources for roofing and the completion of the facility, which will provide a permanent place of worship for the congregation.

3.6 EDUCATION

The District organised a BECE Sensitisation and Mathematics Clinic on 12th April 2026 at Ramseyer Congregation to prepare candidates academically and psychologically for their forthcoming examinations.

A mock examination in English Language and Mathematics was subsequently organised on 19th April 2026 to assess candidates' readiness and identify areas requiring further improvement. These educational interventions reflect the District's commitment to the holistic development of its young people.

4.0 NOTABLE EVENTS

- Induction of Rev. Chief Superintendent Michael Baakwaw as Minister-in-Charge of Trinity Congregation on 15th March 2026.
- Participation in the Ga West Presbytery 10th Anniversary Youth Games on 7th March 2026.
- Participation in the Presbytery Children's Rally at Ebenezer Congregation on 18th April 2026.
- Ramseyer YPG won the District Bible Quiz on 3rd May 2026 and subsequently won the zonal competition, qualifying for the Presbytery competition.

5.0 CHALLENGES

1. Inadequate number of trained organists and choirmasters across congregations and preaching points.
2. Funding requirements for the completion of the Krokohwe Pavilion Project, particularly roofing and finishing works.
3. Sustaining youth and young adult participation and retention in church programmes.
