DEPARTMENTAL GOALS

Committee on Administration and Human Resource Management

Key Performance Indicators:

- ❖ DAHRM-01: The District organized training for Junior Youth leaders in the district.

Strategies:

- ❖ A training seminar was held for leaders in the district; the facilitators were Mama Sally Ann and Mr. Kwasi Oteng Yeboah on the topics: “The role of the JY leader as a mentor and counsellor and upholding the JY work as a ministry”. This was held on Saturday 23rd May 2026 at the PCG, Prince of Peace Congregation’s Chapel. Attendance was encouraging.

Way Forward:

- ❖ The refresher training should be rampant to equip leaders for the task ahead.

Committee on Church Life and Nurture

Key Performance Indicators:

- ❖ Organizing conferences

Strategies:

- ❖ The committee facilitated the organization of district group conferences, the Young Peoples' Guild and the Singing Band. Election of new executives for the guild was conducted.

Way Forward:

- ❖ To ensure, elections are conducted for district executives of the various groups whose tenure is elapsed.

Committee on Mission and Evangelism

Key Performance Indicators:

- ❖ DME- 01 During the quarter at the review, the standing committee in collaboration with the Committee on Mission and Evangelism organized evangelism consultation.
- ❖ Aryaa Preaching Point
- ❖ Evangelism week was duly observed by the respective congregation
- ❖ There was an outreach program during the Emmaus day celebration

Strategies:

- ❖ The consultation was held on the 16th May 2026 at the PCG, AOTC chapel. The theme was "Church growth: our collective responsibilities" on Saturday, 16th May 2026. It was successful as participants were poised for action to increase the numerical strength in the district.
- ❖ The committee, in collaboration with the standing committee, continued to support the growth of the Aryaa and NOP preaching points at Odorkor. Resources were allocated to aid in their development. Additionally, two plots of land have been secured and fully paid for, for the Aryaa preaching point. The land had been cleared and pillars would be mounted soon. A room had been rent to keep the assets of the preaching point. A caretaker had been appointed and would be enrolled in the Presbytery's School of Ministry to be equipped for the task ahead.
- ❖ Thirty-four (34) souls were won during the Emmaus day outreach in the Aayalolo vicinity.
- ❖ During the Evangelism week celebration, various activities were organized and forty-four souls were won.

Way Forward:

- ❖ To continue with the nurturing and support with resources to the new preaching point at Odorkor and Aryaa
- ❖ Training of stakeholders in evangelism would be recurrent.
- ❖ The district would organized evangelism consultation in the next quarter.

Committee on Ecumenical and Social Relations

Key Performance Indicators:

- ❖ There was a seminar on roles of traditional leaders in our Christian worship held at the PCG, Prince of Peace Congregation.

Strategies

- ❖ The seminar was held at the Prince of Peace congregation on Tuesday 9th June 2026. The theme was "the role of traditional leaders in our Christian worship". Nana Osei Ani-Mante

and Nana Korkor Ofeibea Akrofi, Twafohene and Twafohemaa of Larteh traditional area respectively were the facilitators of the day. The program was successful.

Committee on Finance

- ❖ The district successfully transferred its 52/48 contribution weekly to the Presbytery and General Office, also meeting all financial obligations to the higher court.
- ❖ To embarked on monitoring of 52/48 contribution returns by the district audit Team

Strategies:

- ❖ The strategies implemented to achieve the above performance include continuous meetings of the district finance committee and follow-up on congregations after each statutory celebration.
- ❖ The district audit team has commenced on monitoring the 52/48 contribution returns.

Strategies

- ❖ The skilled training program will be on detergents making, batik making, the target group would be single mothers, widows and the youth. The program is scheduled on Saturday 27th June 2026.
- ❖ The committee had started sensitizing congregants in the district for this impending program in the next quarter. The blood donated will be given to the Greater Accra Regional Hospital and the National Blood Bank, Korle bu
